Subj: FOREIGN DISCLOSURE POLICY

Ref: (a) MCO 5510.20B
(b) II MEFO 5510.2

1. Purpose. To establish a policy for Foreign Disclosure.
2. Cancellation. This letter will remain in effect until revision or when indicated by appropriate authority.
3. Information. The Chemical Biological Incident Response Force (CBIRF) supports the foreign disclosure program, as mandated by the National Disclosure Policy-1 (NDP-1), by cooperating with our allies and/or foreign governments, to the fullest extent possible in the development of mutual defense against potential adversaries, while providing safeguards in the protection of our national security interests.
 - a. The disclosure of United States Controlled Unclassified Information (CUI) and Classified Military Information (CMI) to our military allies and/or foreign governments is a significant aspect of this cooperation. The net benefit to the United States and the need to protect and conserve our military information must be measured on a case-by-case basis and not merely be a reaffirmation of previous disclosure decisions. Disclosure authority includes responsibility for ensuring compliance with the provisions of any treaty, agreement, statute, executive order, directive, or instruction involving the disclosure of military information to foreign governments and international organizations. It is imperative to understand that CBIRF will not disclose or direct the disclosure of CUI or CMI except as approved or authorized by II Marine Expeditionary Force Foreign Disclosure Office.
 - b. It is essential that requests for foreign disclosures are processed and coordinated in accordance with the listed references. All requests must be routed and vetted through CBIRF's Foreign Disclosure Representative prior to foreign nationals visiting the confines of CBIRF properties, or prior to governments, or international organizations.
4. Scope. This policy letter pertains to all military personnel assigned to Chemical Biological Incident Response Force.
